Susan will present an introduction to playback theater, psychodrama and sociometry. Attendees will explore how to use sociometry to unpack current political issues and use those cultural themes for psychodramatic exploration via vignettes. Playback theatre will be explored through stories related to how power and privilege have affected group members, and showing how a playback performance could be structured around such a theme.

Randy McCommons, RDT/BCT, MFT has been practicing Drama Therapy and mental health for over 30 years. Randy currently runs a private practice and serves as adjunct faculty at CIIS in San Francisco, CA and Antioch University in Seattle, WA. This session,
