New Approaches in Role Theory and Method

Recent innovations have come to light that have pushed both role theory and method into their next iteration. We will collectively investigate these emerging avenues and how they impact drama therapy from both a practitioner and client perspective. Workshop attendees will gain a greater understanding of forthcoming theoretical and practical applications.

A Dynamic Introduction to Ethnodramatherapy

Ethnodramatherapy is the implementation of Mienczakowski's Ethnodrama method, supported by various Drama Therapy interventions. It is used to give voice to and to process issues with highly marginalized populations. Since 2005, Dr. Snow has employed this integrative methodology in two projects with adults who have developmental disabilities and in another with adolescents in youth protection. The workshop will explore all aspects of this new methodology.

Beyond the Phases (in the Integrative Five Phase Model of Drama Therapy)

This presentation will not focus on the five phases, but rather will explicate updated elements, principles, and therapeutic values at the core of Integrative Five Phase Model of Drama Therapy. The model was developed in the context of group work, but its application in individual drama therapy will also be discussed.
