Shuttles/Taxis:

SuperShuttle (includes airport service): <https://www.supershuttle.com/ada/#gref>. Patrons can book in advance and simply need to check the box that indicates "Wheelchair Lift/Ramp Required to Board". Patrons can choose to book one way or round trip and can choose to share a ride or go non-stop at various price points. The NADTA has a discount code for the shared ride option. Ride KC Buses: <http://ridekc.org/mobility-services/paratransit-info> & <http://ridekc.org/rider-guide/disability-resources>. All buses are fitted with lifts or ramps to make them accessible. The 229 will get you from either terminal at the airport to crown center near our hotel. Bus route info here: <http://ridekc.org/rider-guide/visiting-kansas-city> & 229 route here: http://ridekc.org/routes/229_boardwalk_kci. Patrons would get on at MCI and go all the way to the 27th street stop to be closest to our hotel. Obviously vice versa for the return trip. Note: This is not a door-to-door option.

Free Street Car (does not do airport service but is great for exploring nearby areas): <http://kcstreetcar.org/how-to-ride/accessibility/>. Accessible providing 100% level boarding at all stops at the middle doors of the cars.

Sheraton Kansas City Hotel at Crown Center: All areas of the hotel are accessible by wheelchair accessible elevator. Additionally, they offer rooms that are accessible with grab bars in the shower as well as rooms that are fully accessible with wheel in showers. When you go to make your reservation at the NADTA group rate, if an accessible room does not show up online, there is a place for "other requests" where you can indicate what kind of accessible room you need. If you want to be sure, you can call the hotel and have them pull up your reservation and note that it needs to be accessible. You can also choose to call the hotel directly to make your reservation-- be sure to tell them that you are coming for the North American Drama Therapy Annual Conference but wanted to book via phone to ensure your accessible room so you get both the appropriate room and our group rate.
